- 1. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar, Director welcomed all esteemed IQAC members for the meeting.
- Dr. Gauri Prabhu, IQAC Co-ordinator read the minutes of the last meeting held on 14th January 2019 and the Action Taken Report for the same. The IQAC members noted the Action Taken Report and confirmed the Minutes of the last Meeting.
- Dr. Gauri Prabhu, IQAC Co-ordinator presented the Activity Report of the Institute for the Academic Year 2018-19. The IQAC members noted the Activity Report and appreciated the efforts taken by the AISSMS IOM Team.
- 4. Shri. Suresh Shinde, Hon. Jt. Secretary AISSM Society and other IQAC members congratulated the Institute for obtaining the Prestigious A+ Grade with CGPA of 3.27 from NAAC for period of five years from 04th March 2019 to 03rd March 2024. He recommended that we should continue and enhance our efforts towards achieving excellence in education.
- Dr. Gauri Prabhu, IQAC Co-ordinator presented the 'Exit Report' of the NAAC Peer-Team. The IQAC members discussed the same and noted the recommendations given by the NAAC Peer-Team.
- 6. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar, Director shared with the IQAC members that he is member of the Core committee established by Savitribai Phule Pune University for the revision of MBA 2019 pattern curriculum. This curriculum will be implemented from the Academic Year 2019-20. Shri. Suresh Shinde, Hon. Jt. Dr. Gauri Prabhu IQAC Co-ordinator suggested to organize and participate in meetings and FDPs regarding curriculum revision.
- Mr. R. R. Deshpande, Joint M. D., Kirloskar Oil Engines Ltd. suggested that the Institute should provide certain courses for working professionals to enhance their educational qualification. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar, Director suggested to start educational program for working professionals.
- Shri. Suresh Shinde, Hon. Jt. Secretary, AISSM Society suggested to the Institute to provide infrastructural facilities to Government Organizations, Agencies, Industries, Non-Governmental Organizations, Professional Bodies, etc. for various activities like training programs, examinations, etc.



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- 9. Dr. Gauri Prabhu, IQAC Co-ordinator highlighted the fact that seminars and workshops conducted in the last Academic Year were highly beneficial for the students.
