ICT Tools Usage



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

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- Discussions and Resolutions: The IQAC members discussed various points and decided following initiatives to be undertaken for improvement in the quality of the Institute:
- Dr Abhijit Mancharkar, Chair IQAC, and Director AISSMS IOM, Pune extended a warm welcome to all esteemed IQAC members in the meeting.
- Dr. Gauri Prabhu, IQAC Coordinator, read the minutes of the last meeting and the Action
 Taken Report held on 01st June 2022. The IQAC members confirmed the Minutes of the
 Meeting and appraised the Action Taken Report (ATR). While Dr. Gauri Prabu
 highlighted the various Quality initiatives under IQAC, AISSMS Institute of
 Management.
- Dr. Bhagyashri Kanhere, member IQAC, and Academic Coordinator, AISSMS IOM, presented the AISSMS IOM, activity report. She presented various value-based initiatives and the holistic approach nurtured while conducting these activities. All present IQAC members appraised the same.
- 4. It was discussed in the meeting to focus on the student well-being, as well as personality, and professional development of the students. Dr. Bhalchandra Bite suggested that the self-understanding of the SWOC, along with aptitudes of the students through the psychometric test shall enable the student in their academic excellence career planning, and holistic professional and personal growth. Dr. Gauri Prabhu added that the Institute to provide counselling based on psychometric test shall give guidance and enable decision making regarding academic and professional pathways. Mr. Suresh Shinde appreciated the unique initiative and recommended for continuation of the psychometric test and counseling activity.
- 5. It was discussed in the meeting that the students must undergo corporate skills development initiatives to acquire cutting-edge and industry-oriented competencies. The need was felt to focus on the deliberate implementation of the diverse, multi-faceted, and value-added certificate courses to improve soft-skills competencies, and eventually the employability of the learner in collaboration with Academic and Industry experts.

 Mr. R. Deshpande recommended planning for appropriate value-added and domain-specific certificate courses for the students in collaboration with Industry, and domain experts, professional bodies as well as academic institutions. Dr. Gauri Prabhu informed that the institute organizes such certificate courses every semester/year and assured the IQAC members that the institute shall continue to organize such courses in the future as well.

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- 6. It was discussed in the meeting that the 1-Connect programs integrate more hands-on experiences for both faculty and students through guest sessions, seminars, and workshops etc. This integrated approach will bridge theory and application, ensuring graduates are well-prepared for the dynamic business landscape. This initiative aligns with the Institute's commitment to 'Crafting valued corporate professionals' and contributes to the holistic approach through various activities like Capital Market Awareness, Nurturing Winning Habits, Exploring Global Opportunities and Perspectives, etc., added by Dr. Gauri Prabhu. Mr. Suresh Shinde, proposed to plan more activities on the same line for the students and faculty members.
- Dr. Bhagyashree Kanhere informed the IQAC about the MBA-I and MBA-II-year students' academic orientation and induction sessions. These sessions are organized to orient the students about the MBA programs.
- 8. It was discussed in the meeting and concluded with common consensus that advancing the objectives of the extracurricular activities to create the holistic personality development avenues for students. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar recommended to outline the extracurricular activities in line with Institute's vision, mission and goals. To broaden the reach of the activities, the Institute should explore potential collaboration with other clubs, institutes, organizations to co-host interdisciplinary events and broaden the reach of the activities.
- 9. In the meeting, the previous various activities under Specialization Club Activities were reviewed. Dr. Bhagyashree Knahere provided the feedback on the Specialization Club Activities and commented the fame of the activities in the students as these activities are fun based learning. Mr. Suresh Shinde noted that the previous events received positive participation and engagement from both students and faculty members. Further he recommended that the scheduling of future events aimed at promoting social and educational learning activities like role play performances focusing on educational themes to enhance learning in an interactive manner.
- 10. Dr. Bhalchandra Bite put forth various impactful activities organized/conducted by the institute towards humanity and social causes. He mentioned various activities like Swatch Wari Workshop, Anti-Drug Program, Samajik Aikya Pandharawada, Blood Donation Camp, Walkathon, etc. conducted under Extension and Social Activities, etc. to make students and faculty members more prudent in social responsibilities. Shri. Suresh Shinde expressed his satisfaction and recommended organizing more humanitarian activities in support of humanity and unity of the society.

11. It was discussed in the meeting that the National Services Scheme (NSS) plays a pivotal role in fostering social responsibility, community engagement, and leadership CERTIFIED TRUE COPY Page 3 of 6



- development for students. Dr. Bhagyashree Kanhere suggested it would be a great initiative to organize a NSS camp for students to participate in meaningful community services as engaging in skill-building activities, and to develop socially conscious and civically engaged leaders.
- 12. Mr. Vikrant Gaikwad mentioned that the Pune is emerging as the startup hub for aspiring students and incubates. The institute should launch various activities and facilities to support aspiring entrepreneurs in developing and scaling ventures, startups, etc., he added. Mr. Suresh Shinde seconded the point of discussion and recommended to strengthen the Institutional Startup and Innovation Cell to organize various activities to promote the culture of entrepreneurship, startup, and innovation.
- 13. Mr. R. R. Deshpande suggested to promote the social initiatives for the cause of gender equality. He referred the various provisions made under UN-17-SDGs for strengthening gender equality. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar suggested that the Institute should ensure that the institute should organize various gender equality activities in alignment with SDG-17 for more efficient results.
- 14. In the meeting it was discussed to organize "Author Speaks" sessions. Dr. Gauri Prabhu reiterated the objectives as to provide students with insights into the journey, experiences, challenges, and successes of renowned authors. Mr. R. R. Deshpande recommended that the Author Speaks sessions should be more relevant and interactive in nature for the students.
- 15. Dr. Pooja Upadhyay presented various activities conducted under International Cross-Cultural Interface. The present members apprised the same and recommended to continue to host cross-cultural interface sessions. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar recommended to make these sessions more interactive, inclusive, and engaging to ensure meaningful cross-culture exchange.

Dr. Bhalchandra Bite mentioned that the students are participating and winning at various intercollegiate activities like business plan competition, Management Quiz Competition, etc.
- 17. Mr. R. R. Deshpande mentioned various developmental activities across Pune, which is influencing Pune's social and economic conditions. The students should be made aware of of the same and contribute to the cause, he added. Mr. Suresh Shinde seconded the thought and recommended visits to industrial live working locations to promote experiential learning, and experiential atmospheres.

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- 18. Mr. Vikram Gaikwad raised the point in the meeting that the alumni base is one of the important stakeholders for institutional development. Organizing periodic Alumni meetings for pass-out students is a valuable endeavor to strengthen the connection with Industry, offer mentorship and guidance for current students, and promote lifelong learning, and alumni engagement. - 19. The IQAC committee discussion deliberated on advancing various activities and emphasizing a holistic approach. Recognizing stakeholders beyond students and faculty members, the discussion encompassed alumni, industry partners, regulatory bodies, and the local community. A consensus emerged on the need for a comprehensive strategy that integrated varied perspectives. Members stressed a holistic approach, focusing on transparent communication, collaborative initiatives, and fostering a sense of belonging. This broader engagement aims not only to enhance the academic experience but also to strengthen the Institute's ties and bonds with the community and industry through MoUs and collaborative activities, ensuring a well-rounded and impactful educational environment. Dr. Gauri Prabhu informed the present IQAC members that the Institute has signed MoUs with various reputed educational institutes, industry, and NGOs and working on various activities under these MoUs.
- 20. It was discussed in the meeting, Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar acknowledged the crucial role of effective branding and strategic approach towards placement. Dr. Pooja Upadhyay suggested to organize a HR meet as an opportunity to engage with HR professional, understand industry requirements. It was further discussed that the Institute can showcase the strengths of our institute and collaborate for mutually beneficial partnership. It was discussed further and recommended to collaborate with apt professional bodies for HR Meet.
- 21. Shri. Suresh Shinde mentioned the importance of stakeholders' relationship strengthening and their engagement in developing institutional brand. He further mentioned the role of Faculty members and students in driving these activities. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar oriented the various activities like participation in educational exhibition organized by various media houses and broader engagement aims not only to enhance the academic experience but also to strengthen the stakeholder relations with the community, alumni, parents, reputed educational institutes, and industry, ensuring a well-rounded and impactful educational environment. The IQAC members expressed satisfaction with the various activities organized and participation institutes institutes.

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- 22. It was discussed in the meeting and the decision was made that the Institute shall organize Faculty Development Programs and Staff Development Program to enhance the competencies for the future challenges in education industry. Mr. Suresh Shinde recommended that the faculty shall attend various FDPs to develop futuristic skill sets as well.
- 23. Dr. Pooja Upadhyay oriented the IQAC present members about Research activities. Mr. R. R. Deshpande recommended that promoting research culture and fostering intellectual inquiry are ingredients of academic research activities. It was discussed in the meeting and the need was felt to provide the structured research activities and coursework to nurture research skills. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar pointed out that the PhD Course work Part-I has already started in collaboration with Savitribai Phule Pune University to enhance and nurture research culture within the institute.
- 24. It was discussed in the meeting and the need was felt to have promote and aware the NEP implementation and implications on current educational scenario. Mr. Suresh Shinde proposed to have a workshop/seminar on NEP-2020 in collaboration with Savitribai Phule Pune University. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar proposed to apply under Savitribai Phule Pune University Quality Improvement Program (QIP) to organize an event to address the role of an accreditation in NEP-2020 implementation and related aspects for the Higher Education. All present IQAC members seconded the thought unanimously.
- 25. It was discussed and decided that the Institute should now conduct the Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) for the Academic Year 2021-22.
- The meeting of IQAC concluded with the permission of the chair.







- 17. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar recommended that the institute shall strengthen the professional relation to the lumni, Parents, Industry, reputed academia, various industries, and CERTIFIED TRUE COPY



NGOs. Present IQAC members seconded the recommendation. Mr. Suresh Shinde suggested to sign MoUs for the focused collaborations.

18. It was discussed in the meeting that the Institute shall reach to the various stakeholders. Mr. R. R. Deshpande suggested to participate in various Edu fair, Edu fest, Education exhibitions, etc. to meet and orient stakeholders about management education.

- 19. Dr. Pooja Upadhyay raised faculty and staff development programs for the future discussions. It was further discussed and decided that the Institute shall continue to host various competency development activities for faculty members and staff members. Mr. Suresh Shinde recommended to organize value added and employable knowledge-based development initiatives in future.
- 20. It was discussed in the meeting and the need was felt that the institute shall collaborate with more professional bodies. Dr. Bhalchandra Bite mentioned that the Institute has conducted activities with NIPM, O-HR, PMA, AIMS, etc. professional bodies. Dr. Abhijit Mancharkar recommended to host more qualitative and informative activities under collaborations with professional bodies.
- 21. Dr. Pooja Upadhyay mentioned that the institute shall organize various research and development initiatives. Dr. Gauri Prabhu seconded the mention and added that the Institute shall raise the research graph in near future.
- 22. Dr. Gauri Prabhu presented the AQAR report to the IQAC, the present members accepted the same unanimously. Further it was decided to submit AQAR report for the Academic Year 2021-22 in September, 2023.
- 23. Dr. Gauri Prabhu informed all present IQAC members that the Institute is preparing AQAR for Academic year 2022-23. She further added that the Institute also preparing for the NAAC 2nd Cycle accreditation. All present members appraised the same.
- 24. The meeting of IQAC concluded with the permission of the chair.
